Mr Kirby told me on a confidential basis that a very good RUC source, not one to always defend the British Army had given him some details about the killing of Mrs. Doherty at Lifford Bridge, Strabane on 13 April.

- I. The British Army was expecting an attack of some kind that night and the men were edgy.
- 2. It is normal practice to level weapons on a car.
- 3. The car was about 200 metres from the military checkpoint when the incident occurred. It was approx. I50 yards on the northern side of the border.
- 4. The gun went off accidentally.
- 5. It was, according to the RUC source, a million to one accident.
