The Foreign Office have written to the Embassy following a conversation

Which Hugh Swift in which he had asked informally about the purchase of

'helicopter gunships', which he thought were called chinooks, by the

British Army. I gather that Hugh had asked for enquiries to be made but

there does not appear any correspondence from the Department on this

matter. The FCO have now replied that the Ministry of Defence is buying

chinook helicopters from the United States. It adds that these could not

at all be regarded as helicopter gunships but are large load carrying

helicopters intended for moving stores and equipment and sometimes

passengers. There is no present intention of using them in Northern Ireland.
