I.C.T.U. PETITION - PROTECT THE RAIL LINK

Dear Branch Secretary,

You will have seen from Press publicity that the Irish Congress of Trade Unions has decided to undertake a major campaign against the bombing and disruption of the Railway Line between Dublin and Relfast.

The purpose of the campaign is : -

- to protect the lives of workers and passengers on the Pailways;
- b) to protect the jobs of Railway workers :
- c) to prevent the economic damage which the disruption causes to the economy on both sides of the border ;
- d) to protect the right of passengers to travel freely by rail between the two largest population centres on the island


The campaign consists of <u>a special petition</u> in which Unions are being asked to collect the signatures of members; <u>a major rally</u> of workers from North and South and <u>meetings with Ministers</u> in Publin and Belfast.
