PROPOSED U.S. TRAVEL ADVISORY ON DUBLIN/BELFAST RAILWAY

- 1. AS MENTIONED, I WAS TELEPHONED THIS MORNING BY SHERARI COMPERCOLES OF THE ERITISH EMBASSY AND SAID THAT THEY HAI BEEN INFORMED IN LONDON BY THE U.S. THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT WOULD BE ISSUING A TRAVEL ADVISORY CONCERNING THE TUDELIN/BELFAST RAILWAY ON TUESLAY NEXT. COMPERCOLES SAID THAT THEY UNDERSTAND THAT OUR MINISTER HAD CALLED IN U.S. ARBASSAIDR HECKLER TO EXPRESS CONCERN ABOUT THE PROPOSEL ISSUING OF THE ADVISORY. COMPERCOLES SAID THAT THE BRITISH VIEW WAS THAT ISSUING THE ADVISORY WOULD BE "A PITY" BUT IT MUST BE FOR THE U.S. TO MAKE THEIR OWN JUDGEMENT CN THESE MATTERS. THE BRITISH HAVE ENCOURAGED THE U.S. NOT TO OPENLY PUBLICISE THE ALVISORY.
- 2. COMPER-COLES'S PURPOSE IN CALLING WAS TO FIND OUT OUR REACTION TO THE AMERICAN DECISION. HE SAID THEY ''COULD REINFORCE'' ANY APPROACH WE MAY MAKE TO THE U.S. AUTHORITIES ON THIS MATTER.
- 5. SUBSEQUENTLY, I RECEIVED A CALL FROM KEN LONGMYER, IRELAND LESK OFFICER AT E/STATE, WHO REFERRED TO A CONTACT WHICH HE HAL WITH MR O CRIDIAIN OF THIS OFFICE SOME WEEKS AGO IN WHICH LONGMYER HAL INDICATED THAT L/STATE VERE CONSIDERING SOME SORT OF ANNOUNCEMENT RESARDING THE RAILWAY, HAVING REGARD TO AMERICAN CONCER'S FOLLOWING THE FAN AM 103 INCIDENT. LONGMYER ADDED THAT ALTHOUGH THE IRISH AND BRITISH SIDES HAD ARGUED AGAINST THE ADVISORY THE U.S. HAD DECIDED TO ISSUE ONE, WHICH WILL BE DONE AT THE L/STATE SPOKESPERSON'S BRIEFING ON TUESDAY NEXT, AUGUST 22ND. LONGMYER ADDED THAT AMEASSADOR HECKLER HAD BEEN INSTRUCTED TO CONVEY THIS INFORMATION TO THE MINISTER AT LUNCH IN IVEASH HOUSE TOLAY.

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4. CLEARLY, THE ISSUING OF THIS ALVISORY IS LIKELY TO GENERATE WELLA AND OTHER COMMENT HERE. WE WOULD BE GRATEFUL FOR AN INDICATION OF THE LINE WHICH YOU WOULD PROPOSE WE TAKE IN THESE CIRCUMSTANCES. WE WOULD ALSO BE GRATEFUL TO KNOW OF ANY FURTHER ACTIONS YOU PROPOSE TO TAKE VISHA-VISITHE U.S. AUTHORITIES IN

- 1. FURTHER TO MY C158 OF TODAY, PLEASE FIND ANNEXED TO THIS TELEX THE TEXT OF THE TRAVEL ADVISORY IN QUESTION, WHICH I OBTAINED FROM LONGMYER OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT.
- 2. LONGMYER SUMMARISED AS FOLLOWS THE 'TALKING POINTS' SENT TO AMBASSADOR HECKLER FOR ME IN HER CONVERSATION TODAY WITH THE MINISTER!
  - THE ADVISORY DOES NOT ADVISE AGAINST TRAVEL TO NORTHERN IRELAND. IT FOCUSSES INSTEAD ON DELAYS FOR INTENDING TRAVELLERS
  - THE US RECOGNISE THE VALIDITY OF THE MINISTER'S CONCERNS.
    HOWEVER, THE US BELIEVE THAT AN ANNOUNCEMENT TO TRAVELLERS
    IS NECESSARY AND IN THIS CONTEXT REFER TO THE PAN AM 103
    INCIDENT. THE US UNDERSTAND THAT THE INCIDENTS ON THE
    DUBLIN/BELFAST RAIL LINE ARE NOT AIMED AT AMERICANS
  - THE US HAVE TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT THE CONCERNS ABOUT AFFORDING A PROPAGANDA VICTORY TO TERRORISTS.
- 3. LONGMYER EMPHASISED TWO POINTS THAT THE ADVISORY WAS A MILD ONE AND ADDED THAT THE BRITISH HAD BEEN CONCERNED AT THE PROSPECT OF A STRONGER ADVISORY.

## FOR TRAVELLERS TO NORTHERN IRELAND

TRAVELERS TO NORTHERN IRELAND SHOULD BE AWARE THAT FREQUENT BOMB THREATS AND SMALL EXPLOSIONS BY THE PROVISIONAL IRISH REPUBLICAN ARMY HAVE INTERRUPTED RAIL SERVICE, ESPECIALLY ON THE BELFAST-DUBLIN LINE. SINCE THE EXPLOSIVES HAVE BEEN PLACED ON THE TRACKS AND NOT ON THE TRAINS AND AUTHORITIES HAVE RECEIVED WARNINGS, THERE HAVE BEEN NO INJURIES OR DEATHS TO DATE. AUTHORITIES HAVE RESPONDED BY CLOSING THE TRACKS AND PROVIDING ALTERNATIVE TRANSPORTATION BY BUS: TRAVELERS SHOULD BE PREPARED FOR DELAYS AND SHOULD FOLLOW THE ADVICE OF THE AUTHORITIES.
