A brief statement issued shortly after the Supreme Court decision said: "We are very disturbed that owen Carron has been allowed to make wee of the political offence exception. Coming so soon on the heels of a similar ruling in the case of Finnucane, this is a most worrying decision. We cannot accept that acts of terrorism, which put peoples' lives, be they members of the security forces or the general public, at risk, are in any way political. Those who perpetrate thes callous and evil deeds should be brought to justice. We shall be studying the judgments closely, as soon as we receive them, in order to see how situations such as this can be avoided in future".
