Note of anonymous phone call 9.20 am Wednesday, 26 June, 1991 (English Public School Accent) - said official source close to the talks.

- 1. Asked that message be delivered to Mr Hume.
- 2. To be careful of speeding process up that is was part of further plans to intensify the process and get a few more steps down the road of agreement to a stage when to stop would look ridiculous and wrongfoot those (ie SDLP) in the process so far. He said that "after the meeting yesterday, contact was made along these lines" and that "hokey pokey" was going on between Mr Mawhinney and the DUP in particular since the Alliance Party had come out in favour of intensification.
- That in the talks, it would involve getting to such a stage in the present negotiations that it would not publicly be in anyone's interests that the 16th go ahead.
- 4. That Mr Mawhinney leans towards the opinion and wants to ensure that talks don't break down, owing to his NI extraction, and also his above mentioned view that he would want to have official policy made more flexible re 16th and that he will be pushing for a decision in that regard this morning both from SOS and the parties involved.
