- The reasons given for the action were to obtain political status and 'segregation from republicans'. No mention was made of the prospective hunger strike and no intelligence has come to light as to the likely 6 candidates. H L T Murphy in H7 sattempted to act as spokesman but was not allowed to do so. Both UDA and UVF affiliated prisoners are involved.
- There is considerable evidence of intimidation inside the prison and a number of prisoners expressed concern about their relatives outside.
