Dear Councillor,

On the next day that the Anglo-Irish Conference meets in Northern Ireland it has been decided that a special protest should be mounted at Stormont by all Unionist Councillors in Northern Ireland.

Thus on the day that the Conference sits all Unionist Councillors, of both parties and of none, along with Unionist Mayors and Chairmen, wearing their Chains of Office, are asked to meet at 1 p.m. sharp at the Great Hall in Parliament Buildings, Stormont. We will then lead a procession of all Councillors down to Stormont Castle where a protest will be handed in on behalf of all our constituents.

It is imperative that there is a full turn-out. We therefore implore you to make such arrangements as will enable you to be present. Of course, notice of the meeting, which may be imminent, will be short and you will have to largely depend on the public media.

In order to facilitate your admission to the Stormont Estate we enclose a letter of invitation to a meeting at Stormont which you should present at the security barrier after having yourself filled in the date of the meeting.

Perhaps you would ensure that independent Unionist members of your Council are alerted and invited to this protest. Otherwise please treat the matter in confidence.

We look forward to seeing you at this protest in furtherance of our united campaign to smash the iniquitous Hillsborough Agreement.
