ANGLO-IRISH AGREEMENT : PR GROUP

ANGLO-IRISH AGREEMENT : PR GROUP

It has been decided to establish within the Office a small group to advise the Secretary of State on public relations aspects of the Anglo-Irish Agreement. The group, which will normally meet in Belfast on a daily basis or as required, will be chaired by Mr Scott, or in his absence by Mr Gilliland. Other members will include Mr R Templeton (who will be temporarily detached from other duties for this task) and representatives from PAB, LOB and Information Services in London. Representatives from other parts of the NIO and NI Departments may be invited to attend as necessary.

The Group will monitor developments following the conclusion of the Anglo-Irish Agreement and review the Government's strategy on the presentation of the Agreement. It will identify opportunities for Ministerial speeches, broadcasts, letters, newspaper articles, etc; and will either prepare the necessary material itself or commission it from other parts of the office. Among other things, the group will consider commissioning opinion surveys as a means of ascertaining public attitudes to the Agreement so that the PR campaign can be directed to the best effect.

The work of the group and the need for its continuance will be reviewed in two month's time.
