



I am sure that the MOD are well aware of most of the incidents referred to which span fifteen troubled years in Northern Ireland. But in assessing whether or not the Irish and the Nationalist Community in the North have legitimate concerns regarding the behaviour of the UDR you might consider whether it would be useful to put together a comparative list of incidents involving members of the Regular Army over the same period. If the list is roughly equivalent then we can effectively argue with the Irish that the behaviour of the UDR is no worse than that of the Regular Soldiers. yes inteed. INVOLVEMENT OF UDR IN CRIMINAL AND OTHER ACTIVITIES

/ I attach a letter which Sir Alan Goodison has sent to Mr. Goodall and which he has copied to Mr. Brennan as well as to me. I should be glad to have your comments and advice on the enclosure. My initial reactions are as follows.

- 2. There can be no gainsaying that the list makes unhappy reading; and no one in his right mind would seek to condone the individual (proven) offences which it contains or to gloss over their cumulative effect. I certainly wish to do neither. At the same time, I would be inclined to attach more weight to it if it had not been "compiled in haste"; if DFA were able to say that they had done all that they could to ensure that it did not "contain a number of mistakes"; if it did not lump all the categories together in one list (making it look impressively long) but listed them separately; and if it had been made clear in each case whether the offender was a serving member of the Regiment or a past member at the time of the offence.
- 3. Whether we respond, and if so in what terms, must I think depend upon how far we believe the list to be factually accurate as well as upon the strength of our misgivings about its format and the thinking underlying it. We first have to be as sure as we possibly can be that our own perspective of the subject is the right one. After that, we can - and I believe should - make every effort to persuade others to share that perspective, even though we may not be very hopeful of success. In this instance, therefore, the basic question is how far DFA's perspective differs from ours.
 - 4. We also have to share the responsibility in the correct The Ambassador has not copied proportions between NIO and MOD

his letter to MOD; perhaps colleagues in London would ask RID whether they have done so or intend to do so - or whether, alternatively they would have any objection to our copying it to MOD and/or HQNI.



INVOLVEMENT OF UDR MEMBERS IN CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES, CONTROVERSIAL SHOOTINGS AND HARASSMENT, 1970-1985

1. You will recall that during the talks between the British and Irish delegations on 31 July Michael Lillis showed me, and did not object to my retaining, the list I attach under this heading. He said that it had been compiled in haste by a Third Secretary and no doubt contained a number of mistakes. He did not intend us to take it as a formal document. I reminded him that the information which we had given him about the involvement of members of the UDR in crime had also been approximate in character. Nevertheless, I think the list is worth circulating as evidence of the kind of thing which the Irish Government think about when someone mentions the Ulster Defence Regiment.
