

David Rupert is the American double agent who infiltrated the Real IRA, which carried out the 1998 Omagh bombing which killed 29 people, and subsequently gave evidence which helped convict McKevitt of leading the RIRA.

McKevitt (57), from Blackrock, Co Louth, who is serving a 20-year sentence in Portlaoise, is one of five defendants in the multi-million pound case.

The others are Colm Murphy and Liam Campbell, both from Dundalk, Seamus Daly, from Culloville, Co Monaghan, and Seamus McKenna, from Silverbridge, Co Armagh.

The court has already been told that Mr Rupert will not be giving evidence after the FBI, which has him in protective custody, backed out of an arrangement for him to provide testimony by videolink due to risks to his health and security. But lawyers plan to submit his written evidence when the hearing gets under way in September.
